Gastonia East Rotary Donates to Gaston County Schools ROBOCHALLENGE 2015

On Monday, February 23, 2015 Carrie Minnich, elementary schools curriculum coordinator for Gaston County Schools, presented an update on the ROBOCHALLENGE 2015. Carrie's report to the club showed the human side of the program that Gastonia East Rotary began supporting last year through funds raised with our involvement with CaroMont Health Community Challenge 2014. Carrie told us of a group of students from Cramerton Middle School called the Chefs that include two team members that have Asperger syndrome. Their involvement with the robot program has helped them immensely in working in social settings and with presentation skills.

Carrie also told us of an all-girl robot challenge team that has gone well above the confines of the contest guidelines by developing fund raising efforts to help students at Holy Angels. The girl power team has also developed a real app for the iPad to help these children. The team plans to continue meeting and raising funds after the program ends for the year.

Gastonia East Rotary provided \$5,000 in funding to support this year's program.

This year's donation came from our Community Foundation Fund as a part of the remaining proceeds from last year's fund raising efforts with the community challenge.

Gastonia East's initial gift in 2014 which was \$15,000 and was raised from the 2014 CaroMont Health Community Challenge proceeds. Those funds were matched by an additional \$15,000 from a Rotary District Matching Grant. That generous gift expanded the program and provided funds that would allow more students to participate.

The proceeds from the 2015 CaroMont Health Community Challenge will go to support this program next school year. Our goal is to raise \$16,000 though the event so that the program can continue to grow and flourish for our students.

Without our help this program may not even be offered to our students. This is a program that Gastonia East Rotarians can point to and say, "I made a difference!"
